



## Ohio River Museum

Schedule an educational day at the Ohio River Museum, located just one block from Campus Martius. Focus on the relationship between people and the river. View steamboat models and artifacts from hundreds of inland boats. Learn about freshwater mussels and the impact that invasive species such as the zebra mussel have had on native species. Much more.

## Campus Martius Museum

Campus Martius Museum was built in 1928 on the site of a fortification called Campus Martius. The name is Latin for “field of Mars” and derives from the fact that many of the Ohio Company’s leaders had knowledge of ancient Rome. The original fortification, established by the Ohio Company of Associates in 1788, was the home of some of the area’s first American pioneers. The Rufus Putnam House, the remaining structure from the original fortification is preserved in the museum and open for tours.

Campus Martius and the Ohio River Museum are operated by a joint partnership of the Ohio Historical Society and Friends of the Museums, Inc., each a nonprofit organization. OHS serves as the state’s partner in preserving and interpreting Ohio’s history, archaeology and natural history. Friends of the Museums manages the daily operations of the museums.
